Meeting Summary:

Orvis Campbell called the meeting to open at 12:00 PM on Friday, October 6, 2017 with 19 members present. William Harding made a motion to accept September minutes with Dee Phillips seconding. All voted yes.

Old Business:

Jodi Salvo shared how well the fair booth went. It was set up by the Sheriff's Department and shared also with the EMA. It was one of the most visited for all ages. Special thanks to all that worked it.

New Business:

Prescription Drug Disposal Campaign-Orvis shared that October 28, 2017 from 10:00-2-00 will be the next Drug Take-Back Day to be held at Union, Trinity and Mercy Hospitals. There are 3 billboards, radio spots and flyers. Thanks to Peggy Leslie, Dee Phillips and Connie Limbacher for getting at least 2500 flyers passed out. Both Twin City Hospital and Union Hospital have made sure their doctors, pharmacies and personnel have the flyers, as well. See Connie if you need more flyers for distribution. **Prescription Drug Disposal Detera Bags**—Jeff Neidig reported that the ADC did receive the \$30,000 grant to purchase over 9,000 bags in two different sizes. The smaller size would hold up to 20 pills and the larger up to 45 pills. Post card sized data collection cards and instruction cards will need to be created similar to the ones designed and used by Summit County. Committee next steps will be to identify financial

and distribution partners and plan a kick-off event. Event will be arranged in early December, to educate identified distribution partners, create media engagement and create a way to distribute bags to distribution partners. Mark Murphy envisioned using Youth to Youth (Y2Y) as the Bolivar-Zoar area partner.

Hidden In Plain Site—Jodi reported that there have been 6 events since last meeting and 4 more up-coming presentations. This is a great opportunity to show parents, grandparents, etc. ways to engage youth in conversations to help prevent substance use. ADC members were encouraged to promote presentations to community. HIPS will be held Oct. 9th in Twin City area and Nov. 18th 11:00-1:00 at Tuscora Park. Elvis will perform afterwards. Any money received will go to Share-A-Christmas.

Sector Committee Reports:

Youth Serving Sector: Amy Miller introduced Brennan Mathias from Dover as our Youth Sector Chair. Jodi thanked him on behalf of the ADC for the work the entire Y2Y is doing in our community and their schools.

Local Government/Legislative Sector: Al Landis reported that Katie Seward, Andrea Domanick and Jodi have been working with Attorney General's office to do a follow-up round table next Friday, October 13 at 1:00 pm at Union Hospital by invitation only. There will be a variety of people there including police, fire, EMT's, judges, prevention staff etc. from our community to discuss what is happening in our area and what can be done to make a positive impact and stop the drug epidemic. Rep. Landis also reported that he has been appointed by the Speaker of the House, to the Controlling Board, so now he will be on the distribution side of funding. This is funding already allocated and he will see when the funding actually gets distributed. Rep. Landis has partnered with Adam Wilgus Magistrate, Tuscarawas County Juvenile and city mayors to go into county schools to discuss branches of government and to give an anti-drug message. Presentations have been well received from students and schools.

Media Sector: Amy Miller, Miles Riley and Marcia Stuart will work with Dave Ramsell to design a palm card that the coalition can use for recruiting and ADC marketing.

Substance Abuse Treatment Organization: Dave Schaffer shared that the ADAMHS Board is working on a proposal with JFS and Twin City to use \$120,000 from January 1, 2018-June 30, 2019 appropriation budget to help families and have a withdrawal management center. He also mentioned putting together a rapid response team to work with persons and families of suicides. Dave was thanked for his service as he will be retiring at the end of the month.

Miles Riley made a motion to adjourn and Dave seconded. Meeting adjourned at 1:25 p.m.
